Manager Erickson mentioned the Land and Water Summit that will be held January 1<sup>th</sup> 5through the  $17^{th}$  in Winnipeg.

## **OLD BUSINESS:**

There was discussion on the funding for the preliminary engineering for the West Intercept. The Cot Roseau approved matching funds. The County sent a checkin the amount of \$9667.00 to the RRWD. There was concern about the word "Loan" on the check. The Boardnstructed Administrator Sando to return the check to the Roseau County Auditor. A **motion** was made by Manager Carriere and seconded by Manager Frislie to increase funding from \$6700.00 to, but not to exceed, \$9667.00. Carried– unanimous.

Administrator Sando discussed the COE's request for a financial analysis and a letter of intent. **Motion** to follow through with the execution of letter of intent and resolution was made by Manager Carriere and seconded by Manager Moser. Carried– unanimous.

There was discussion on the Overall Plan Dave Grafstrom was informed that rough draft copy would be needed by the end of January.

Manager Erickson showed the Board a letter from the COE that the Duxby Levee is in unsatisfactory condition. Administrator Sando will be responsible for inspection of the levee.

Darrell Lins requested reviewing his ringlike. There was also discussion on the rock riprap at the Lins Bridge. Administrator Sando will check the contract with Mr. Lins for his dike and ask him to attend the February meeting.

The meeting was reconvened at 8:30 a.m. on January <sup>1</sup>/<sub>8</sub> Board Managers present were Ferrell Ericksn, Raymond Moser, LeRoy Carriere and Allison Frislie. The purpose of this meeting as to provide information to landowners near the Grimstead impoundment site. Chairman Erickson thanked everyone for attending and referred to a handout showing the potential Grimstead impoundment area. Administrator Sando talked about the possible sites and the Project Work Team ranking. Engineer Rood discussed the suitability of the sites as well as some site characteristics. Comments from landowners included questionson pool levels and length of time, affects of geese and ducks on a nearby turkey farm, compensation for land that can no longer be farmed (purchase of land verses flood easement), height of the dike, dam safety issues and the operation and maintenance difet project. Chairman Erickson again thanked everyone for attending and invited any suggestion of comments in the future. After a short recess, the 10:30 meeting with the landowners in Malung impoundment area. Carried-unanimous.

Administrator Sandoreceived a letter from a concerned land owner in one of the impoundment areas. The board requested Administrator Sando send a letter to the landowner requesting more **imf**ination such as the legal description of the property.

Tom Raster, USACE, attended the PWT meeting June<sup>2d</sup>, and presented a revised timeline for the Hay Creek Project. There were also representative from the Turtle Mountain Tribe at that meeting. The scussed concerns about culturally sensitive properties in project areas. The final ERR/EA report is due out next week. Pat Moren commented on a letter from Marsha Maclauski. The raft EAW, which is being completed by MN DNR, is almost done.

Administrator Sando will contact Don Nolting concerning the proposed ring dike for Joe Loren.

After some discussion on per diem rates, **anotion** was made by Manager Voll and seconded by Manager Frislie to adopt the IRS rate for per diems. Carried- unanimous.
